

Introduction

Establishing a Fleet Safety Policy

- Create a Driver Safety Handbook Outline clear expectations for safe driving, accident reporting, and vehicle maintenance.
- **Driver Eligibility & Screening** Implement background checks, driving record reviews, and age or experience requirements.
- Define Acceptable Vehicle Use Establish rules for personal use, passengers, and cargo transportation.
- Implement a Zero-Tolerance Policy Strict policies against distracted, impaired, or reckless driving

Driver Training & Accountability



- Onboarding Training Require all drivers to complete safety training before operating fleet vehicles.
- Ongoing Training Programs Provide refresher courses on defensive driving, accident prevention, and vehicle handling.
- Monitor Driving Behavior Use GPS tracking or telematics to identify risky behaviors and reinforce accountability.
- **Incident Review & Feedback** Review past accidents or violations to improve safety measures and prevent recurrence.

Preventative Maintenance & Inspections

- Routine Maintenance Schedule Regularly service vehicles to prevent breakdowns and costly repairs.
- Pre-Trip & Post-Trip Inspections Require drivers to check brakes, tires, fluid levels, and lights before and after each use.
- **Emergency Repair Procedures** Establish a response plan for unexpected vehicle issues on the road.
- Fleet Replacement Strategy Know when to retire aging vehicles to maintain efficiency and safety.

Risk Management & Insurance



- Assess Liability Coverage Ensure your nonprofit has the right level of fleet insurance for accidents, theft, and damages.
- Reduce Risk Through Proper Documentation –
 Maintain detailed records of inspections, maintenance, and driver history.
- **Develop an Accident Response Plan** Train staff on proper steps to take in case of an accident (refer to Emergency Fleet Checklist).
- Minimize Costs with Safe Driving Incentives –
 Reward employees for accident-free driving and compliance with safety policies
